

We will let you know ASAP when we have a date set but we may need to move fairly quickly in the New Year so search for your images now to have them ready to print when the time comes.

We meet at Campbelltown station at approximately **5.30am for departure to Central** (exact time will depend on 2024 train timetable).



Photographic Challenge - Narooma

A photographic challenge was set for members on the Narooma trip, which was 'Black and White Reflections'. The goal was to capture an artistic reflective image in black and white, using a full range of tonal zones from darks to midtones to lights. Display an interesting array of shapes, shape distortions and textures.

The Narooma team entered a great array of images and the judge had a hard time sifting through the entries to select the final winner. Three images were awarded Highly Commended which were -

- · EarlySwim by Eileen Neville
- · Sitting on the Dock of the Bay by Marie McLaurin
- · Cheese Please by Eileen Neville

And the winner was.....

Water Reflection by Christine Maidment

The judge said "Truly amazing ripple and reflection effect. In a perfect world the top right hand corner could be toned down to bring out more texture as it is there. But it is certainly artistic and would look different in colour and your eye would pick up different things and not the beautiful textures".

Christine says of her image -

"I quite enjoyed the challenge set for our Narooma trip. I mainly went looking for interesting reflections of boats that had some colour on them (orin the reflection). The reflection chosen as the winner was from a boat with some bright red paint against a white hull; not exactly sure as whentaken, I focused on the patterns not the whole boat. With the red on the boat and blue sky reflected in the water, it worked well in B & W giving a wide tonal range, with mainly some colour adjustments in Lightroom Classic".
