Looking at some interesting but somewhat frightening statistics it makes it clear why we need to make our photos stand out from the rest. Currently about 1.81 trillion photos are taken worldwide every year, which equals 57,000 per second, or 5.0 billion per day. The average person takes 20 photos daily. This number is higher among younger people and lower among older people. 92.5% of photos are taken with smartphones, and only 7% with cameras. So think before you press the shutter button about what image you are trying to achieve, have you done everything to capture the best image in camera and how you might add polish to it in post production. People of the world are getting swamped with images more than ever before so look at the way that you can capture something a little different that makes it distinctive to the tidal wave of photos out there.
