

Competition Night - June 12



Our June Competition will be on Wednesday the 12th. Our judge for this event is Graham Cam. Graham has extensive experience in the photographic field. Read his biography below -

"Passionate about bird photography since the age of 21, with my first camera being a Pentax Spotmatic II. My photographic journey has spanned the film

era to the digital era, from recording bird banding and conservation projects, particularly through the film era, to making the most of digital technologies over the

last two decades.

I shoot at a professional level, which includes a Nikon Professional Services membership. I enjoy printing and displaying my works, and this has led to three major exhibitions, the last exhibition in 2022 with the National Trust of Australia, promoting bird conservation globally through the medium of photography.

As a long-term member of two camera clubs in the Blue Mountains, I enjoy engaging with other like-minded photographers. Whilst I have mentored and appraised images for bird photographers for several decades, I recently decided to formalise my judging

by become an accredited judge having attained the desired level of expertise and

training with the NSW Federation of Camera Clubs.

I was awarded Honorary Life Membership of Birdlife Photography - Australia in recognition of my leadership and innovation between 2015-2020. Most recently I was presented with the Tom Oliver Award - 2024, which is a Special Birdlife Photography Award for outstanding photography education. Most recently, I have taken on the role of coordinator for our national bird photography competition, the BAPA (Birdlife Australia Photography Awards), which opened for submissions on the 24 th May until 5 th August. In recent years I stopped showcasing my images on Instagram but I have decided to re-engage from next month – you can see some of my older Instagram images at 'wildcamphotography'".

The challenge for this month is "Down Low".

Take an image from down near ground level (or some other large base object such as a platform or table etc) aiming horizontally to capture an attractive scene from this different low angle.

A down low-angle shot is a shot in which the camera is placed well below eye level, near the ground, and aimed more or less horizontally to capture the subject (it isn't taking an image from the ground pointing up at the tree tops for example). Since these shots are taken from a different angle, they add attractive details to the setting. Low-angle shots make your subject appear larger, wider, taller, and closer. This unique perspective is also called the frog perspective.

Low-angle photography offers a unique majestic perspective that arrests your viewer's attention and forces them to look at your photo for a longer.

It is tempting to use a wide-angle lens for this but in most circumstances, it is not required and can overly distort the image.

Developing a Portfolio - June 19

On June 19, we have our second Zoom meeting with member Tony Naumovski, where he talks about developing a portfolio, or "body of work" for exhibition. This is a series of up to 8 images following a "theme" or that are connected in some way - for example an architectural theme may have images of architecture but also other aspects of building.

The Zoom meeting is part of the preparation and planning to move toward an exhibition later in the year in November 2024. For this meeting, Tony has requested that those participating present an "artist's statement" that defines their vision -

- A poetic interpretation of your work, supporting the conceptual and visual connections in your work.
- Self awareness of how other artists or sources have inspired or influenced you to make your work.
- A brief discussion about why you are making the work

There is no need to provide images just yet - this meeting is part of the planning and preparation. If you are interested in being a part of this, you are welcome to join this meeting. After June 19 however, there will be no further opportunities as latecomers will have too much work to catch up on.
